Summary of whole school PPG spending 2015/16			
Objectives in spending PPG: To assist all pupils entitled to PPG in making expected progress in English & Maths. To support them emotionally and enrich their lives wherever possible.			
Summary of spending and actions taken: Teacher employed to support reading (KS1) and progress and attainment (KS2). Specific interventions are run to support children's academic progress, emotional wellbeing: dramatherapy, nurture group and FSW worker.			

Outcomes to date:

- The gap between disadvantaged children and national outcomes at KS1: -13% reading, -17% writing and -6% maths.
- Progress from EYFS to KS1 shows school on or above National in all areas except emerging and exceeding writing.
- Reading, writing and maths combined is 5% greater than National.
- Positive value added in writing and mathematics with reading being just below National for all pupils.
