Barriers to future attainment (for pupils eligible for PP)

In-school barriers

- Low entry levels in Foundation stage mean low starting point for children.
- Spelling Punctuation and Grammar skills are low - impacting on quality of writing.
- High numbers of children with emotional needs that can impact on learning.

External barriers

- Limited amount of support at home due to level of family education.
- Family engagement with school.
- Children have not always had breakfast

Summary of whole school PPG spending 2017/18

Objectives in spending PPG:

To assist all pupils entitled to PPG in making expected progress in English and maths (with a focus on maths).
To support them emotionally and enrich their lives wherever possible
To improve parental engagement with the school and with children's learning.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Teacher employed to support reading (KS1) and progress and attainment (KS2). Specific interventions are run to support children's academic progress, emotional wellbeing: dramatherapy, nurture group and FSW worker.

Impact:

- Year 1 phonics (mainstream class) shows disadvantaged performance equal to disadvantaged National (68%).
- At expected standard in KS1 (mainstream class only) disadvantaged close to National in maths (1% lower) and above in reading (13% above). In writing 100% of children achieved expected
- At KS2, Reading, writing and maths combined is 1% greater than National.
- Positive value added in writing, with reading being close to National (cohort size affects confidence) maths being well below National (a small group of children had very poor progress which skews this outcome greatly - small cohort size).
- At KS2 disadvantaged equalled National average for higher level attainment in writing.
